Dear Friends,

50 years ago in June 1975 a cargo ship laden with bananas sailed into Cork. Our beloved predecessor Walter Burrell was actively searching for souls. A young 16 year-old seaman from St. Lucia in the Caribbean was convinced by him to attend church. After studying John 3:16 at Walter's home John Honore was wonderfully Saved by the Lord, and God became the centre of his life. At the end of September we were blessed to have John visit us again, and help with the ship ministry. He has been serving with SCFS for 30 years in St. Lucia, and recently helped plant our work in Alaska. The Cruise Season over there is also seasonal.

In Cork we have around 100 cruise ship visits between April and October. It's been wonderful having our Crew Lounge up and running thanks to the Port of Cork and our team of volunteers. One week I was particularly busy as we had 6 cruise ships, as well as a number of cargo ships. Sometimes, there are just too many ships to visit them all. I was very sad to miss visiting a Korean tanker in the oil refinery with a wonderful name - Rich Harvest. It made me think of the sad reality that many of us may be missing rich harvests all around us each day. The giant cruise ship was the star attraction in the Port and few, if any, even noticed the oil tanker across the other side of the harbour.

There is of course the harvest field of the World, but how about your personal harvest field? Each of us has a work to do for Jesus. Let's be busy about our Master's business, and not our own projects. We must build His Kingdom, and not our own. People in the West are so focused on retirement, pensions, safety, insurance, enjoyment, but what about eternity, and the thousands and millions of souls passing into the night? "Lord give us eyes to see, and ears to hear. May we not miss the harvest right in front of us. Amen."


